FOUR DIFFICULT DAYS AHEAD!! - Refurbishment

- To prepare for these four days you will need to bring in a water bottle, with water in it. You will also need to be patient as you wait for the toilets.
- With good preparation and some patience you can survive the last four days.

After half term everything will be open, water machine back, two snack machines, Year 9 toilets back, Year 10 toilets back and Year 11 toilets now separated from Year 10. Also we get ALL the school back and the white hut will disappear!
